FRIA / Remote ID Update



The Remote ID (RID) regulation (Part 89) is still set to take effect September 16. This (basically) requires all remote controlled aircraft over 250 grams in weight to broadcast location and other information to enable an airspace traffic safety system. One exception is aircraft flown in an approved **FAA Recognized Identification Area** (FRIA). FRIA applications must be submitted through a Community Based Organization (CBO), in our case the AMA.

Flight at non-FRIA locations will require the use of a factory installed or add-on RID device. So far the available devices are meant to be used with drone flight control boards, and standalone devices are few and expensive. General aviation ADS-B devices are NOT allowed.



We submitted a FRIA application for our main field at the very beginning of the process. We also submitted an application for the float fly area.

AMA has confirmed that our first application was submitted to the FAA. There is no current list of applications that have been approved or denied. AMA says they have submitted 1200 applications and have 300 pending and 200 have been approved. That is all the information that is available at this time.

We will keep membership advised of any developments as they occur.

Tire Damage in Pits

We have been plagued with tire tracks (donuts) in our pits over several months.

Some of these have melted and damaged the asphalt. One of our members at the field in the afternoon witnessed a group of people with mini-motorcycles riding roughshod in our pits.

Members and Invited guests only allowed to fly. Current AMA card required.

Spectators always welcome. You pay your own park entry fee \$5 per car seniors, \$10 per car others. Club collects \$10 landing and lunch fee. Flying from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.; may end earlier if activity slows.

Driving on the walkways to load and unload only is ok, but no parking. Drive SLOWLY and carefully. Obey any instructions by lifeguards or park personnel.

No taking off or landing from the land, no flying over land.
